We're looking forward to welcoming you back to Lowestoft's very own Sunrise Film Festival.

This year marks our fifth annual edition and 2026 is our first edition operating under Sunrise Film Festival CIC, our third edition as a BIFA-qualifying short film festival, and first year as a Grierson qualifying documentary festival.

This year's programme includes a fantastic selection of 263 films, ranging from our traditional short films, feature films, music videos and virtual reality works, selected from over 1,100 submissions.

Submissions this year spanned across 34 countries from around the world, showcased across 52 separate screenings across the weekend.

Our 2026 festival offering includes a dedicated VR showcase, as well as presenting three independent feature films.

We look forward to welcoming many of our nominees and filmmakers behind our selected films to Lowestoft in-person this August, with some travelling from as far as Asia and Finland, and we're delighted they've chosen Sunrise.

Travelling to Sunrise

Train Travel: The best way to travel to Lowestoft from outside our local area is by train via Greater Anglia.

There are direct train services running to Norwich and Ipswich, and on-going connections to Cambridge or London Liverpool Street as well as other locations via Ipswich or Norwich.

Lowestoft train station is situated in the town centre, with easy access to explore our festival. Local offerings, restaurants and hotels are all a short stroll away or further afield by taxi or one train stop back to Oulton Broad.

Bus Travel: National Express services cover Norwich and Great Yarmouth via Norwich, you can get the X22 bus from Norwich Bus Station or Great Yarmouth Bus Station. From Great Yarmouth you can get the X1 to Lowestoft Bus Station in the town centre.

If travelling by car, we encourage you where possible to car share.

Our 2026 Selection

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This year, Sunrise Film Festival welcomed a record number of film submissions, equating to just over 305 hours of viewing. With this spike in submissions came longer films, greater diversity in themes, and fresh takes on familiar stories.

Once again, we recruited a group of volunteer curators to build our most exciting programme yet, showcasing the incredible talent and creativity of filmmakers from across the UK and beyond. The films you'll see at Sunrise this year are bold and enlightening, telling important stories.

Our Core Strands

Our programme is arranged into thematic strands, meaning that whatever you're interested in, we've got it covered.

Looking to champion local stories and homegrown talent? Check out East Anglia on Film. Want to watch films exploring personal, cultural and universal experiences? Don't miss Sharing Our Stories.

If you like watching by genre, be sure to catch It's Giving Comedy, a strand celebrating the breadth of the comedy genre in all its exuberant, bewildering and darkly funny glory. Are You Afraid is our raucous late night horror strand.

Beyond this, The Next Wave highlights the work of exceptional filmmakers at the beginning of their careers.

And, of course, our powerhouse strand, Break the Stigma, bringing together films which address commonly misunderstood topics and amplify lived experience.

New This Year

We've expanded our drama genre to explore ideas of home, the ties that bind us, crime, and power, to create 9 individual drama screenings.

We've similarly expanded romance to include a dedicated twisted romance screening alongside a more traditional, heartfelt romance screening, celebrating the joy, vulnerability and beauty of human connection, which also includes a short film entitled Dating Mark Silcox directed by comedian Joe Lycett.

Our 5th edition also sees us, for the first time, showcasing sci-fi in a dedicated genre themed screening within its own dedicated 90-minute slot.

We're also screening three independently produced feature films by filmmakers from Norfolk and Suffolk. Featuring Breakwater, The Creature From Scroby Sands and Disremember.

About Us

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Sunrise Film Festival CIC exists to illuminate and empower the next generation of creative voices, by uniting the energy of our annual film festival, with year-round initiatives, workshops, and events for underrepresented talent.

Sunrise Film Festival began in 2021, with the simple belief that a coastal town like Lowestoft deserves access to inspiring cinema, creative opportunities, and a genuinely accessible platform for new voices.

Founded by Joshua Freemantle, Sunrise was created to champion diverse stories and support emerging filmmakers who might otherwise struggle to be seen. What began as a grassroots idea, has grown into Suffolk's largest film festival, celebrating diverse stories and underrepresented filmmakers, and arguably the biggest 4 day celebration of underrepresented talent across the UK.

Over the past five years, Sunrise has grown into a vibrant cultural event for the town and a welcoming space for filmmakers and audiences alike. We've screened over 850 independent films, welcomed more than 8,000 audience members across our festival and year-round activity, and built a loyal community along the way that believes in the power of storytelling.

At the heart of the festival is our commitment to accessibility and representation. We prioritise filmmakers who may not yet have access to larger platforms and we work hard to ensure our festival remains welcoming, affordable and inclusive.

One of the most powerful parts of our programme is our Break the Stigma strand, which highlights lived experiences on screen and sparks important conversations within our community, and our continued commitment to equal programming with our 50/50 gender split pledge across our festival programmes.

Real Impact in Our Community

Our annual festival isn't just about watching films. It's about bringing people together, strengthening community pride, and making arts and culture more accessible.

Our audiences consistently tell us that Sunrise makes a difference in their lives.

- 84% of attendees reported a positive impact on their wellbeing
- 88% felt more connected to arts and culture in their local area
- 91% said they would recommend the festival to others

By uniting the energy of our annual film festival with year-round initiatives, workshops, and events for underrepresented talent, we are building a sustainable creative community. 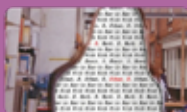

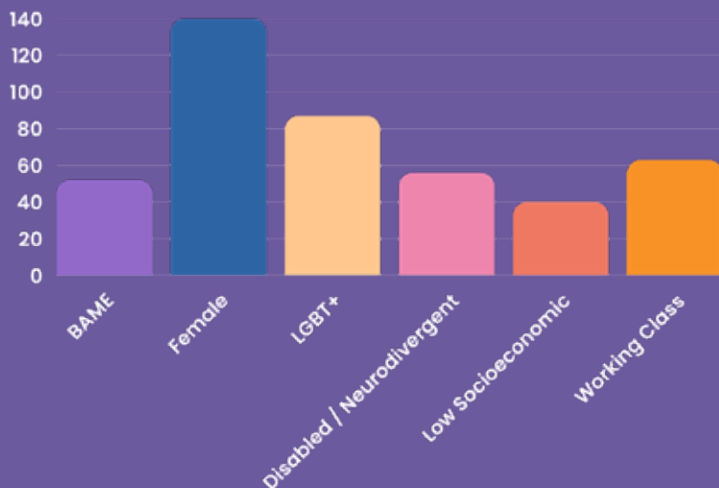
